Levels of Coordination

- ▶ Combine the queues/requests
 - Order of evaluation
 - Joint evaluation for “matches”
 - One reservation

- ▶ Study and approval of service
 - Coordinate study, individual approval
 - Coordinate study, joint approval

- ▶ Scope of the queue
 - All requests
 - Requests with impact
 - Requests “on the path”

Options

1. Current Setup - System as it is today, coordinated and collaborative studies
2. Enhanced Coordination – “match” partial paths, collaborative study
3. Joint Approval - one queue, “pair” partial paths, collaborative study, one answer
4. Common OASIS - options presented in Joint and Common OASIS presentation
